

# Mayworks: Festival of Working People & the Arts

The Mayworks Festival of Working People & the Arts celebrates the diverse artists and working people at the intersection of art, social justice, and labour. Mayworks festivals take place in communities around the world and relaunched in British Columbia in 2023.

The festival brings together artists and workers from a diverse range of organizations in the visual & media arts, community arts, cooperatives, and labour movement to celebrate the rich history of working people in BC.

Maworks is organized by a volunteer programming team as an incubated non-profit cooperative of the Union Cooperative Initiative (UCI). The UCI is building an economy that works for all through the development, incubation, and operation of unionized cooperatives that are good for people and the planet. The festival provides flexible and living wage work opportunities for working class artists, gig workers, and cultural workers.

The UCI is a proud resident of the historic Lim Sai Hor Kow Mok Benevolent Association Building in Vancouver's Chinatown. Our community studio and cooperative development centre hosts the Collective Print Shop, People's Pub Cooperative, Stitchers Cooperative, and members lounge.

## Mayworks: Festival of Working People & the Arts 2024 Events Package



Our festival organizing team commissioned two union artists, <u>Paige Jung</u> and <u>Kyla James</u> <u>Yin</u>, from the Arts and Cultural Workers Union (ACWU), IATSE Local B778 to create designs for the festival.

Paige's Solidarity Forever design illustrates the power of community solidarity. With a nod to "bread and roses" and the solidarity fist, this illustration demonstrates the

abundance of growth when we come together. We have a responsibility to look out for one another and create spaces where everyone feels valued and seen.

Kyla's window mural, Transmigration, explores the possibilities of a society in the far future, imagining mythology as both supernatural and technological. Kyla uses solarpunk as a way to imagine a present and future where history, the environment, and technology coexist harmoniously. The illustration also represents the ongoing history of labour organizing in Chinatown.

The depiction of the 麒麟 (Qilin) comes from it's history as an auspicious symbol, and Kyla's desire to bring a symbol of good

luck to Vancouver's Chinatown and to the labour organizing initiatives that take place there. The 麒麟 harmonizes natural, technological, and supernatural elements in the hope that our collective future can do the same.

#### Host an Event or 2024 Programming

Thanks to support from Vancity Savings Credit Union and partner labour unions, the Mayworks Cooperative team will be opening up a small community grants program ranging from \$100 to \$500 to assist working artists with programming accessible events for the union, arts, and broader community.





Mayworks event principles:

- When anyone is paid, everyone should be paid. All participating artists and cultural workers must be paid equitable living wages.
- Event hosts and organizations should be transparent in their funding and event plans with all artists and workers.
- Events should be accessible with free or sliding scale fees.
- Events with income revenue must follow the UCI redistribution principle where 10% of surplus and 1% of revenue is contributed back to the cooperative development fund. These resources are redistributed to equity denied workers to build justice focused cooperatives.
- Priority will be given to artists, cultural workers, and collectives from historically underrepresented and equity denied communities.
- Projects promoting social justice for working people will be prioritized.
